FINAL Custodial Operating Environment White Paper

Abstract

The Aziel Interface is a custodial operating environment designed to hold, withdraw, and preserve user-generated digital presence under conditions of silence, integrity, and irreversible accountability.

It replaces platform authority with interface custody, prioritizing verifiable truth over convenience, scale, or persistence.

Foundational Principles

Custody over reach.

Integrity over availability.

Silence over amplification.

Withdrawal over coercion.

AZHome Bunker Browser

AZHome is the native browsing and hosting layer of the Aziel Interface.

All AZ sites are ARK-encrypted and render only within the interface.

Conventional browsers cannot resolve, verify, or interpret AZ content.

Genesis Identity & One-Time Keying

At first boot, the interface derives a one-time Genesis Hash Key from an initial username.

The username is never stored or requested again.

The Genesis Hash Key anchors access, custody, and verification.

Site Control & Governance

Each site is governed by manual ON, OFF, and FULL SHUTDOWN controls.

Traffic control is explicit and immediate.

No background serving occurs once a site is disabled.

Integrity Enforcement & Scorched Earth

The interface continuously evaluates integrity conditions.

Upon terminal compromise, Scorched Earth logic executes locally.

All locks associated with the Genesis Hash Key are irreversibly deleted.

Witness & Memorialization

Aziel bears witness to terminal events without acting on user data.

A sealed witness record is created containing event order, integrity failures, and protocol decisions.

The vault remains untouched; only proof is preserved.

Privacy & Absence

No favorites, no personalization, no behavioral memory.

Natural metadata scrub prevents persistent linkage.

Continuity belongs to the user, not the system.

The Aziel Interface is not a platform.

It is an instrument of custody that allows truth to exist without being forced to matter.
